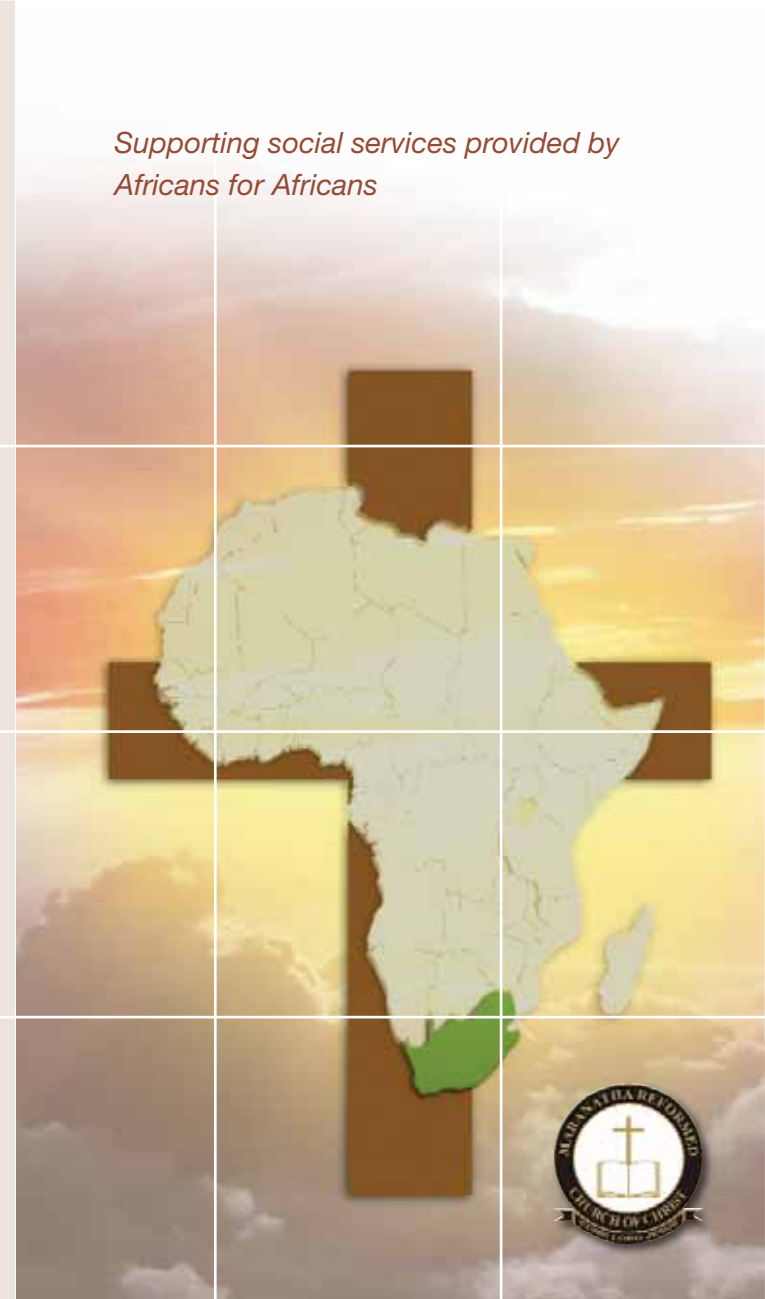
How can you help ?

Caregivers improving quality of life

In a postcolonial world, many South African communities face the negative consequences of globalisation, increasing poverty and unemployment, aggravated by the HIV/AIDS pandemic. All South Africans have a vocation to contribute to the well-being of their country, including faith-based organisations, which have an important role to play in Africa's healing process.

- undertaking social-scientific multidisciplinary research

The Centre for Missional Ministry

The Centre for Missional Ministry works closely with the MRCC and AIM to achieve the above objectives. These organisations empower individuals in disadvantaged communities to become leaders who will have a positive impact on their communities. Since 1945 a total of 170 students have been educated and equipped with life skills, after which they have been redeployed to underprivileged communities.

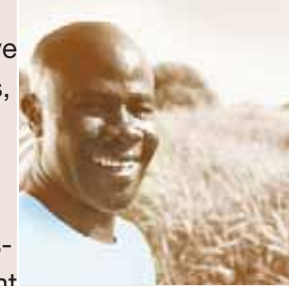
The Center supports the MRCC with the establishment, maintenance, and development of its administrative infrastructure. Together the Center, AIM, and the MRCC contribute to ensuring sustainable social upliftment, transformation, community support and financial relief.

The Maranatha Reformed Church of Christ (MRCC)

There are currently 93 ministers within the MRCC deployed across South Africa, all of whom have graduated from AIM and the now University of Limpopo in Polokwane.

They do not only serve their communities through faith-based initiatives, but also assist others to initiate, manage and monitor various community projects that will ultimately result in better living conditions, e.g:

- managing and operating crèches
- initiating self-help projects such as



establishing vegetable gardens and poultry farms

- establishing sewing projects that provide training and financial resources
- supporting entrepreneurial skills development
- supporting corporate insurance services that offer



funeral benefits to disadvantaged households. Graduates are also deployed in various areas of need at universities, missionary houses, government departments, the police service, the defence force and emergency medical services.

The Africa Institute for Missiology (AIM)

Through a contractual agreement with the Faculty of Theology of the University of Pretoria, AIM students are academically endorsed with a Diploma in Theology after five years of successful study, whereupon they may apply for enrolment in the university's honours programme. The institute has an annual pass rate of 97% across all modules with 99% of first-year students completing their studies. Students are also encouraged to become involved in various community projects, thus enabling them to give back to others in need.

By creating a network of community champions who offer support and care for people in need, AIM is able to:

- address issues such as teenage pregnancy, divorce, abortion, HIV/AIDS, crime, etc
- distribute food and clothes to poor communities
